Dear friends and co-workers with Christ,

Though this church closed in 1971, its legacy lives on. As I write this letter, Nori and Shelly

just had the "soft launch" of **"Hope Community Church"** last Sunday. In September, Richmond Chinese EFC bid farewell to **Allen and Hannah Chang** as Pastor of English Ministries, and since then, they have teamed with **Steve and Gillian Sharpe** and **Daniel and Joyce Wong** in what has come to be known as **"The Steveston Project."** Please pray for these church planting projects and the missionaries providing leadership to them.

Hope City Church, our "multi-generational, multi-cultural, English-speaking" church plant with LPD Church Planting Missionaries, **Philip and Grace Yung** continues to grow and to increase its outreach to Central Burnaby. **New Living Assembly** in Chilliwack, led by LPD Church Planting Missionaries **Noel and Lynda Macasaet**, with **Charlz and Ruth Sebastian** at their side continues to reach out to recent immigrants from the Philippines.

As we look to 2017, we anticipate having seven church planting missionaries serving with our district. They are:

- **Jonathan and Harmony Ng,** serving the downtown east side residents of Vancouver, in partnership with "**Servants Vancouver.**" Jonathan also serves as a resource to district churches, as we reach out to the "downtown eastsides" of our own neighbourhoods.
- Philip and Grace Yung, church planters with Hope City Church
- Noel and Lynda Macasaet, church planters at New Living Assembly in Chilliwack.
- Nori and Shelly Anderson, planting "Hope Community Church" in Port Alberni.
- Allen and Hannah Chang, Daniel and Joyce Wong and Steve and Gillian Sharpe, the church planting team for the Steveston Project.
